"The Necklace" Symbolism

Objectives: to demonstrate understanding of symbolism, locate text evidence to support a claim, write a paired passage open-ended response, and embed textual evidence.

You will choose 2 pieces of construction paper, 1 small and 1 large. Students should choose lighter colors (no black or your writing will not show up).

- 1. Cut out 4 diamond shapes from the smaller piece of construction paper. Use the template below to trace and cut.
- 2. On the FRONT of each of these diamonds, write the answer to the following four questions.
 - A. What does the diamond symbolize when Mathilde first sees it?
 - B. What does the diamond symbolize at the party?
 - C. What does the diamond symbolize after she loses the necklace?
 - D. What does the diamond symbolize at the end of the story?
- 3. Turn the larger piece of construction paper horizontally. At the top, write the title: "The Necklace" Changing Symbolism and Theme by (your name)
- 4. Draw a large necklace on the rest of the construction paper, but leave room to attach the diamonds onto the necklace at the bottom. Be creative with how you design your necklace.
- 5. Glue only the top part of each diamond down so they can be lifted up.
- 6. Under each diamond (on the larger piece of construction paper), you will write textual evidence (quote) that supports your answer WITH THE CITATION.
- 7. In the middle of your necklace, you will hand write or type out a final copy of your paired passage response with Jessie J's "Price Tag." This must fit inside the middle section of your necklace. Don't forget to indent your paragraph!
- 8. Add color, detail, and pizzazz!!!
